

WOMEN'S BIBLE STUDY

Have you ever felt insufficient, ill-equipped, incompetent, or outnumbered?

If so, *Gideon: Your weakness. God's strength*, a 7 session women's Bible study by **Priscilla Shirer**, is for you! After having done these devotionals for a few years, we have discovered that most people are in a mood to write about Advent and Christmas **during the season** rather than asking them to think about the holidays in late summer or early fall. So now we want to work almost a year ahead,

and that is why we are announcing the theme for the 2014 Advent Devotional. The theme is: *"Reel Christmas – Discovering Christ or Religious Themes in Favorite Holiday Films."*

Do you enjoy movies? While some people like new releases, others have several old movies they enjoy viewing during the holidays. Many of us like to see new films, and there are always special releases at the holidays. The Hallmark Channel began the Countdown to Christmas by showing new and old holiday films on November 2. Many of us also enjoy introducing children or grandchildren to films that we have enjoyed.

Over the years, a number of films set at Christmastime have been produced such as *Home Alone, It's a Wonderful Life, White Christmas,* or *While You Were Sleeping.* Other films may include a Christmas segment, for example, *The Fourth Wise Man, Meet Me in St. Louis, Steel Magnolias,* or *The Trouble With Angels.* We are looking for volunteers to select a holiday film and to write two paragraphs. One paragraph is to be about how they see Christ or religious themes in the film and another paragraph is to tell why they like the film so much and how it became a holiday viewing tradition with them.
